

Primary Care Investment Overview

Redistributing health care spending to support healthy communities

Nationally, primary care accounts for 35% of all health care visits, but only 4-6% of spending goes toward primary care





Primary Care Investment Overview

Redistributing health care spending to support healthy communities

National lack of investment impacts the workforce ¹

- Primary care workforce is consistently declining
- Growing patient needs
- Limited pipeline to primary care for new practitioners

Weakening workforce leads to poorer health outcomes for patients

Arkansas communities are feeling the effects ²

- Declining access to and quality of care
- Diminishing workforce with demand exceeding supply

Arkansas has repeatedly been ranked 48th healthiest out of 50 states

The impact of stronger investment in primary care ³

- Lower costs of care
- Improved population health; less chronic disease
- Fewer emergency visits, hospital stays and surgeries

Greater investment in primary care means healthier communities

Primary Care Investment Policy

A path forward for primary care sustainability

- Primary care investment policy seeks to increase the proportion of health care spending that goes toward primary care, relative to other health system costs
- More than 20 states are working to increase primary care investment
- Policy solutions are often collaborative efforts between provider organizations, payers and health plans, and the state



Primary Care Investment Policy

Policy measures states have implemented



Measurement, reporting and transparency



Defining and establishing targets



Monitoring, evaluation and enforcement



SB264: a Solution for Arkansas Primary Care

Supporting collaboration, measurement, and transparency



Convene provider organizations, health plans and other partners into a Primary Care Payment Improvement Working Group



Measure and report current primary care spending in Arkansas



Define primary care, including services and providers, for measurement



Determine target for future investment
